- The department have not sufficient well-furnished class room and separate library room.
- Socio-economically background at the students are poor and backward.
- Less competitive environment.

□ Opportunities:

- Nearly 90% of students are from below poverty level. The department offers a great opportunity for overall progress of such student.
- Improving teachers quality and to engage in Research activities, to attend seminar, workshop, conference and to publish Research Articles in UGC Care and Peer Review Journals etc.
- To improve stock of books in the departmental library.

☐ Challenges of the Department:

- Not sufficient number of teachers.
- Most of the students rely only on syllabus based studies.
- The primary challenge of the department is poor infra-structure of class room and other digital facilities.

☐ Future Plans of the Department:

- Department plans to organize lecture series and national seminar for the greater interest of the students.
- To publish departmental magazine to enhance creativity among student.
- The department plans to introduce Departmental Mouthpiece to enrich the creative skills of students.
